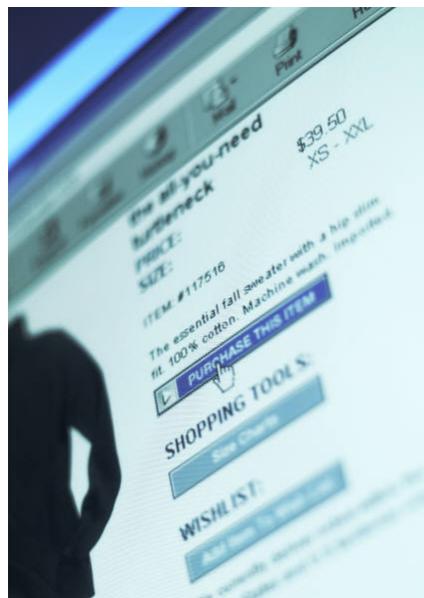


How to Create Your Own Simple Website
