

Virtual Private Networks, revisited

Virtual Private Networks (VPN) are in the news again since Congress passed and the President signed a new law that dismantles Internet privacy for consumers. Basically [Internet Service Providers](#) (ISPs) such as *Comcast, Verizon, Starpower, CenturyLink*, etc. can track your online activity and sell the sensitive data to anyone they like. People who are uncomfortable with this are starting to ask about VPNs again.
