Artificial Intelligence (AI) is in the news a lot these days, but what is it and how can we use it now? This a complex and all encompassing subject, so I will attempt to keep it very simple. "Artificial" means the "intelligence" is created by machines instead of humans. <u>Computer programmers</u>, such as <u>Geoffrey Hinton</u>, have been working on the computer code to make it all work for decades. It is now going mainstream and society has some major issues to tackle on how the technology should (or not) be used when it comes to issues such as elections, warfare, jobs and the professions. This newsletter won't attempt to tackle those issues, but instead, focuses on how we can use AI now.

As with everything else on the Internet these days, there is a lot of junk out there pretending to be Al. If you click on the wrong link or install the wrong app, that could be harmful to your computer or device. So here are some links to the legitimate companies and services in the Al field.

Feel free to play with these new Al tools and let me know if you get stuck on any of this.

Glossary of Terms


First, let's understand a few terms:

- Artificial Intelligence (AI) is "intelligence" created by machines (aka computer code).
- OpenAI is an American artificial intelligence research laboratory founded in San Francisco in 2015.
- ChatGPT is Open Al's Chatbot released to the public in November 2022.
- Chatbot is an Al application to simulate human conversation, you and the machine (the "bot") "chat" with each other.
- Bing Chat is Microsoft's Chatbot powered by ChatGPT. Microsoft invested \$10 billion in OpenAI.
- Bard is Google's Chatbot (competing with OpenAl's ChatGPT and Microsoft's Bing Chat).
- DALL•E 2 created by OpenAI, is an AI system that can create realistic images and art from a description in natural language.
- Bing Image Creator is Microsoft's version of DALL•E 2.

Chatbots

With a Chatbot, you enter into a "conversation" or "chat" with a computer program, a "bot". You might go to a website, or you might use an app on your cell phone. Type anything you want and wait a few seconds for the response. Ask a question, ask it to create something, anything you want. Here are a few examples:

Vladimir Putin has given a number of reasons for invading Ukraine, but the most likely explanation is that he wanted to prevent Ukraine from joining NATO. 
Other possible reasons for the invasion include:

- · Putin's desire to weaken Ukraine so that it cannot pose a threat to Russia in the future.

Whatever the reasons for the invasion, it has had a devastating impact on Ukraine. Thousands of people have been killed, and millions have been displaced from their homes. The war has also caused a humanitarian crisis, with millions of people in need of food, water, and shelter.

The invasion of Ukraine is a major turning point in European history. It has led to a reassessment of security in the region, and it has raised fears of a wider conflict. The war is also having a significant impact on the global economy, and it is likely to have a lasting impact on the world order.

Snoopy and the AI


Snoopy was a beagle,

How to use Microsoft's Bing Chat



Bing Chat is one of the easiest ways to use a Chatbot today. Simply go to https://bing.com/chat in Microsoft Edge. (Note: For now, you cannot use Google Chrome nor Apple Safari, or any other browser, you must use Microsoft Edge browser. If you use Windows 10/11 you already have Edge installed.) If you want to try Edge, you can install it on Mac, iOS (iPhone & iPad) and Android. Click here to download it.



How to use Google's Bard



All the top tech companies will be players in the Al field. Bard is Google's version of a Chatbot. Simply go to https://bard.google.com to get started.

How to use OpenAl's ChatGPT



To use *OpenAI ChatGPT* you must create and account and sign in. *ChatGPT* has a free limited version and a paid *Plus* version. Unless you have a real need or desire to use *ChatGPT*, keep things simple and just stick with *Microsoft* or *Google*'s Chatbots. If you want to play with *ChatGPT* you can create an account at either:

- ChatGPT website: https://openai.com/product/chatgpt to get started
- ChatGPT iPhone app: You can also install the iOS app on your iPhone (you can install it on an iPad, but it is designed for iPhones and will not fill an iPad screen)
 - 9to5 Mac OpenAl launches free ChatGPT for iPhone app

Image Creation and editing with Al

Both <u>DALL*E 2</u> (\$) and <u>Bing Image Creator</u> (free) let you create images by typing what you want in natural language. For a video explanation of how <u>DALL*E 2</u> works, see <u>DALL*E 2</u> <u>Explained on Vimeo</u> (3 minute video).

Here are two examples. One produced a professional looking photo on DALL•E 2 (you must buy credits) and another an amateurish photo on Bing Image Creator.
